## 6 Times Tables

Introduced in Year 4

### Use your 5 times table!

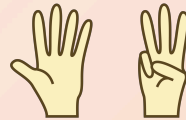
Find 5 x and then add 1 x

To find  $8 \times 6$ :

$$(8 \times 5) + (8 \times 1)$$

$$40 + 8 = 48$$

$$8 \times 6 = 48$$



Hold up the number of fingers  
you're multiplying

Count in 5s by that number

Now add the number of  
fingers you're holding up

(count in 5s then count in 1s)

$$0 \times 3 = 0$$

$$1 \times 3 = 3$$

$$2 \times 3 = 6$$

$$3 \times 3 = 9$$

$$4 \times 3 = 12$$

$$5 \times 3 = 15$$

$$6 \times 3 = 18$$

$$7 \times 3 = 21$$

$$8 \times 3 = 24$$

$$9 \times 3 = 27$$

$$10 \times 3 = 30$$

$$11 \times 3 = 33$$

$$12 \times 3 = 36$$

### Double the 3 times tables to find the 6s!

(because double 3 is 6)

double!

To find  $7 \times 6$ :

$$\text{Find } 7 \times 3 = 21$$

$$\text{Double it} = 42$$

$$7 \times 6 = 42$$

$$0 \times 6 = 0$$

$$1 \times 6 = 6$$

$$2 \times 6 = 12$$

$$3 \times 6 = 18$$

$$4 \times 6 = 24$$

$$5 \times 6 = 30$$

$$6 \times 6 = 36$$

$$7 \times 6 = 42$$

$$8 \times 6 = 48$$

$$9 \times 6 = 54$$

$$10 \times 6 = 60$$

$$11 \times 6 = 66$$

$$12 \times 6 = 72$$



The product  
(answer of two  
numbers multiplied)  
is **always even**
